Carroll was placed on administrative leave as a result of a social media comment made from a personal account. Though the source of the post where Carroll left the comment resulting in his administrative leave is unclear, his comment reads:

"I think perhaps you're not seeing the other side of it. When Nancy Pelosi's husband got attacked and hospitalized in his home, Republicans were laughing, high fiving and doing backflips, hell, it wasn't just [two] months ago they were laughing and high [f]iving about feeding immigrants to alligators. Who were ALSO fathers, mothers, and brothers. Not to mention Charlie also being openly racist. So

you can imagine, while the act is horrific, certainly he ain't (sic) really winning in the empathy

Carroll's comment received widespread attention following disclosure by a well-known right-wing account on X, formerly known as Twitter, @LibsofTikTok. The account's owner, Chaiya Raichik, is known to share content on issues, like LGBTQIA+ and racial equality topics, in a politically charged manner to her 4.4 million followers. Content posted from the influential account has been attributed

to at least 21 bomb threats made to various institutions and individuals.

The post, made on Sept. 15, read, "Travis Carroll, a police officer for Emerald Isle, NC, allegedly made a post online SMEARING Charlie Kirk after he was ass*ssinaated [...] Our tax dollars pay his salary." They also tagged Emerald Isle's official account, asking for the town's thoughts. The post accrued over 8,000 likes, and nearly 4,000 reposts, and prompted a variety of comments. Some users called for Carroll's termination and urged others to demand a response from the town, but even more asserted that Carroll's comment acknowledged the wrongfulness of Kirk's death and did not warrant

"committed to ensuring that all concerns are reviewed promptly and fairly," and that the matter was, "under investigation to determine the facts, origin, and motivation associated with the post, and whether its content is consistent with departmental standards and expectations."


This is not about free speech. It's about being an employee. Police officers, just like the military, are held to a higher standard. Their words must uphold neutrality and public trust. This isn't about silencing opinion—it's about whether an officer's comments undermine confidence in his ability to treat all citizens fairly. When trust is eroded, the whole department is affected.

The First Amendment protects you from the government censoring your speech. Let me repeat, the First Amendment applies only to restrictions imposed by the government. Private companies aren't the government. If a private employer fires an employee because of the employee's speech, there is no First Amendment violation. There is likewise no violation if a private university expels a student for what the student said.

Getting pulled over by him could be your death. No different than Charlie Kirk be killed for his speech.
